## **Project #3 – PANEL PRESENTATION**

CO-ASSIGNMENT WITH ENG 1302:

Panel presentations occur throughout the academic, political, and business communities on a daily basis. These kinds of presentations can be formal or informal and occur at professional conferences, organized meetings, community town halls, and board meetings (to name a few).



For this project, you will select one to three partners to be part of your panel. Together, you will select a current public issue to research. <u>Each member</u> of your panel will select a particular aspect of the topic to research further and then present (<u>3 minutes</u>) to the class as part of a complete formal panel presentation. <u>The basic thrust of this presentation is Information and Analysis</u>.

Each member will TURN IN a <u>speech outline</u> [using the <u>informational speech outline</u> format on page 348-349 of textbook, *Guide to Public Speaking*] and at least 3 <u>research articles</u> (copies turned in with project) to support their part of the panel presentation—along with a <u>Works Cited page in (MLA format)—and a completed copy of page two of this assignment.</u>

<u>Analysis:</u> When you analyze a topic, you break it down into its various parts. You identify and describe the parts—then study how (why, when, where, under what circumstances) these parts fit together to make a whole (e.g. your topic).

An example of a current political and social issue broken down into its constituent parts might be the U.S. military veterans of Iraq / Afghanistan and PTSD:

- Description of the actual theater of war in Afghanistan or Iraq—causes of PTSD.
- Description of PTSD and the medical and psychological needs of soldiers returning with PTSD.
- Description of the support needed by families of soldiers with PTSD.
- What the military is doing/not doing to support soldiers with PTSD. Costs?
- o How do these wars/soldiers differ from WWII veterans?
- And more . . .
